Music lessons - Music for Schools (Years 2-6)

At Bourne Westfield we are very proud of our music provision, and we pride ourselves on giving our children the very best musical opportunities available. On Tuesday 30th January, 'Music for Schools' will be coming into school to run a promotional assembly on woodwind and brass instrument opportunities available in school. Children who learn an instrument can use these skills in music lessons and have an opportunity to join our various bands and ensembles. Further information on registering your children for these lessons will follow after the assembly.

Rock Band (Year 6)

Mrs Beavis will be running auditions for this year's Rock Band this Monday, 15th January in the music room at 12.30pm. This opportunity is open to any children who play guitar, Bass guitar, drums, piano or who want to audition to sing. Children should prepare a short piece to play or sing or something that demonstrates their skills on their instrument. If your child plays the electric guitar or Bass guitar they should bring their own instrument, amps will be provided.

Children will be informed of the outcome of their audition by the end of the week and rehearsals will then begin the week beginning 22nd January.

Band Opportunity (Years 3 to 6) - Calling all Musicians

We have been fortunate in receiving some funding from Lincolnshire Music Service to run an orchestra for all of our children in Years 3 to 6 who learn an instrument. This is an opportunity for all musicians at any stage or grade (even complete beginners) to come together to learn ensemble skills, play music with other young people and have fun.

This opportunity is completely free of charge and open to all children who learn an instrument either in or out of school. They must bring their instrument with them (excluding pianos and drum kits) - we have a full drum kit, additional percussion and plenty of keyboards.

The band/orchestra will be held at Bourne Westfield Primary Academy every Wednesday after school from 4:00-5:00pm in the music room. Access to the music room is through the large green gates at the right side of the school office. It will run for 4 weeks before half term and then 3 weeks after half term with a concert on 12th March. Details of this will follow.

Mrs Beavis from Bourne Westfield will be running the orchestra along with staff from Lincolnshire Music service and she is very keen to get as many children involved as possible.

Sensory Processing

What is sensory processing?

Sensory processing refers to the way we interpret information received from the environment and from within our bodies. This information gives us a sense of who we are, where we are and what is happening around us. Our senses are hearing, touch, sight, taste, smell, proprioception (body awareness), interoception (emotions and social interactions) and vestibular (balance and movement). When our senses are integrating correctly, we are able to respond appropriately to any sensation. For example, we are able to take off an itchy jumper or take a deep breath to smell the flowers.

What happens when a young person experiences sensory processing differently?

A young person may have difficulty working out what is happening inside and outside of their bodies due to sensory information not being accurate, for example, the noise of the school bell is like someone screaming in their ear, or a piece of artwork on the wall keeps grabbing their attention because their brain hasn't registered they have seen it before.

A young person may move constantly to get extra feedback if their body is not providing enough information as to where their arms and legs are. Children may struggle to communicate how they feel resulting in the possibility of being disorganised in a world they cannot make sense of. These children need support from those around them to learn strategies to make life a little easier



Sensory Circuits use sensory-based movement activities which prepare children and young people for the day's learning and help them to achieve the "just right" level of alertness they need to concentrate. They are made up of around 15-20 minutes of activities to help with sensory regulation.

The aim of a sensory circuit is to provide a way for children and young people to regularly receive a controlled sensory input. There are three sections in a sensory circuit:

Sensory Circuits

1. Alerting: to provide both vestibular and proprioceptive stimulation as these can help the child to become more alert.

2. Organising: activities that provide a motor challenge and requires the child or young person to plan, organise and/or sequence their movement.

3. Calming: activities to provide proprioceptive input and heavy muscle work which can have a calming and organising effect.
