## IMPORTANT - Road Safety

Next week our school council members will be out and about in the school safety zone ensuring that parents do not park on the zig zags and single yellow lines. The children have made posters to encourage adults to park safely as we have seen an increase in the number of near misses, dangerous driving, mounting the pavement and blocking neighbours' drives.

Parking in the school safety zone makes crossing the road dangerous for all children. It also causes congestion around the school. Please ensure you are parking legally and **not** within the school safety zone. Please see a map of where you should not be parking or stopping. Thank you for your continued support in keeping your children safe.

Parents are able to park in Sainsbury's and walk to school.

### Parking and dropping off near the school

#### **Do you want children to be safe coming to school?**

Bourne Westfield is in a school safety zone. This means that:



You cannot park or stop on the zig zag lines between 8-9am and 3-4pm.

You cannot park on the single yellow lines between 8am – 5pm unless you have a blue badge.

**NO cars should be parked** on the yellow highlighted areas during drop off or collection.  
**You are putting lives at risk!**
