## Calendar Dates

## Terms 1 & 2 After School Clubs (school led)

The response to clubs for Term 1 and 2 has understandably been very high. It has therefore been necessary to put a cap on the number of children attending depending upon the club, age of pupils and the space. We have allocated clubs now for Terms 1 and 2 but will look at numbers next week to see if we can add more - watch this space. If your child does not get a place in their chosen club this term, there will be further opportunities to apply for clubs in terms 3/4 and 5/6. Children in Key Stage 2 will also have an opportunity to join in lunchtime and music clubs.

School led clubs will start next week (week commencing **Monday 18<sup>th</sup> September**). Club slips will be sent via Parentmail this evening informing parents of which club children have been allocated. <u>ALL</u> clubs finish promptly at 4:00pm. Clubs end on **Friday 8<sup>th</sup> December** – please make a note of this on your calendar. Please note the following:

- Children will be registered at the start of the club; therefore, if for any reason your child cannot attend on the day of the club please let us know.
- All clubs finish at 4:00pm prompt. Please ensure that your children are collected on time at the end of the club. The location of all pick up points from clubs is highlighted on your child's acceptance slips.
- PERMISSION TO WALK HOME AFTER CLUBS Year 5 and Year 6 children require permission to walk home from clubs up to October half term. ALL children must be collected from after school clubs from term 2 due to the darker evenings.

• There is no access to the school car park to collect children from after school clubs.

#### Cross Country (Years 3-6)

All children who signed up for cross country have got a place so please ensure they are at the Kingsley Avenue gate promptly at 8:15am for Mrs Anderson to let them in. Children should come to cross country in their PE kit and bring their school uniform to change into.

#### OPAL News - wet weather plans!

As we recognise the value of play and being in the outdoors, we would like to remind you that our OPAL vision is for there to be fewer than 5 'wet play' days in the school year. This means it is important that your child brings a coat to school every day. Don't forget we have the FOW swap shack on site now if you need anything!

#### Calling all Budding Poets

This year the Willougby Memorial Trust are hosting the Lincolnshire schools poetry competition 2023 and are inviting children to write a poem entitled 'Refuge' (National Poetry Day theme for 2023). The competition is open to all pupils of Lincolnshire schools in the following groups:

Key stage 1: ages 5-7 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> prizes available £20, £15 and £10 respectively Key stage 2: ages 8-10 years 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> prizes available £20, £15 and £10 respectively

The competition will be judged by Emily Dickens, Stamford Poet Laureate and winning poems will be on display in the library at the Willoughby Memorial Gallery from 15<sup>th</sup> November until 24<sup>th</sup> November 2023 (Tuesday-Sunday 12 noon - 5pm). Prize-winners will be invited to read their poems in the library at a prize-giving evening on 24<sup>th</sup> November.

Poems must be in English and no more than 40 lines long, preferably typed or must be written clearly in ink or ball-point pen on one side of A4 paper.

Each poem should have clearly written at the bottom of the page the poet's name, Key Stage number, age of poet, date of birth and school - any entries not clearly marked may not be judged.

- Competitors may enter one poem only.
- No alterations may be made to poems once submitted.
- Poems must be the original work of the entrant.
- No prize will be awarded in any class where entries are not of sufficient merit.
- Poems will not be returned unless requested and a stamped addressed envelope enclosed.
- The Judge's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into regarding the decision.
