# Sports Report from Mrs Anderson

It has been another busy sporting week at Westfield. On Wednesday, we had a coach from Lincolnshire cricket come into school to work with our Reception, Year 2 and Year 3 pupils. Even though the weather was changeable, all the children got stuck in and really enjoyed the experience. All pupils will receive a Parentmail with details of the Chance to Shine cricket programme which is taking place at several local cricket clubs including Bourne, Baston and Market Deeping.

In addition to this, we had four teams of Year 5 and 6 pupils travel to Long Sutton Hockey Club to take part in the annual inter-school competition. On arrival, all the teams took part in some hockey drills before being split into two pools. They then played in a 'round robin' against all the teams in their group. The matches were fast and consisted of 3x5 min thirds. All our teams won some matches and improved as the day progressed. In the afternoon, each team played against teams from the other pool in a play-off match. Two teams made it to the 3rd place play-off match, with one team guaranteed a medal. It was a tough fought match especially at the end of an exhausting day - well done to the Westfield Blues who took home the bronze medals. The teamwork, self-belief, passion, and determination shown by all was second to none. Bourne and Deepings Hockey club train at Arthur Mellows in Glinton on Saturdays and Peterborough Hockey Club also have a good junior section - if you are interested please ask for more details.

- They are a young carer if they are under 18 and help to look after a relative with a disability, illness, mental health condition, or drug or alcohol problem.
- If they are a young carer, they probably look after one of their parents or care for a brother or sister.
- They may do extra jobs in and around the home, such as cooking, cleaning or helping someone get dressed and move around.
- They may also give a lot of physical help to a parent, brother or sister who's disabled or ill.
- Along with doing things to help their brother or sister, they may be giving them and their parents emotional support, too.
