## End of term Sports Report from Mrs Anderson

It has been a busy end to the term. Last Friday, 15 boys and girls from Year 5 went to Stamford Borderville Sports Centre to take part in a Basketball Festival run by the college sports leaders. The morning was spent learning lots of skills and drills. Watching the children grow in confidence, showing determination and resilience was the highlight of the day. One pupil said, "I didn't think I was any good at basketball, and I am now!" After lunch, we played matches against Bluecoat Primary School; for a festival, the matches were tough. We had three teams of 5; all children used the skills from the morning to try to score goals and travel with the ball within the rules of basketball. For lots of the pupils it was the first time they had represented the school, and in a new sport - I was extremely proud of each and every one of them. We also won two individual awards, Gracie-May won Star Girl and Joaquin won most improved! Well done to all the pupils and a big thank you to Mrs Martin and Mrs Pinchin for supporting us on the sidelines.

This week, 9 Year 6 pupils travelled to Skegness Grammar School for the South Lincolnshire Netball County finals; this came after winning our local competition where children finished in the top 11 schools out of a possible 150. We knew it was going to be a tough competition, playing 4 matches before lunchtime to determine the finals in the afternoon. The day was to be one of fine margins; sadly, not winning a match in the group stages, we drew one and lost the other matches narrowly by 1 goal, coming 4<sup>th</sup> in our group. We then went on to win our group play-off match convincingly 6/1, coming 7<sup>th</sup> overall. Well done to all the pupils who played some excellent netball in a tough competition, and what a way to round of their netball at Westfield. A huge thank you to the parents and grandparents who transported the pupils to this event and to those who stayed in the freezing Skegness wind to support us. A special thank you again to Mrs Pinchin who came along and supported us on the side line.
