School Lunches - September 2022

Our new lunch menu for September is now live on the meals website. A copy of the menu has been sent out by Parentmail and added to the school website. The first term is available on the website, so you can order well in advance. This includes our first Theme Day lunch, a Harvest Lunch, on Thursday 6th October.

Tuesday 30th August is the deadline for ordering meals for the first week of term. For parents with children starting Reception in September, please remember not to order a lunch for Monday 5th - Thursday 8th September. All orders, including free school meals, must be placed before the deadline - the kitchen will not be able to accommodate for any unordered meals. A pasta pot meal will be ordered for all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 if no order has been placed.

NOTE - When you next log in to your account, you will be asked to change your child's class to the one they will move up to in September. All other account details will remain the same. If you have a child starting in Nursery or Reception in September you can add them to your existing account. For pupils who pay for their lunches the cost will increase to £2.40 for a single meal or £11.50 for the week. This is due to an increase in operational costs and the cost of ingredients.
