At the end of term 1 all pupils in KS2 took part in an intra house football tournament. This was run in their outdoor PE lessons. It was great to see them all playing for their houses, in mainly mixed football teams. Red team won in Year 6, Blue team won in Years 4 and 5 and Green team won in year 3. When the year group scores were added together the Yellow team came out on top! Well done everyone, you all showed great passion and determination throughout the week.

This week, we took 40 pupils from KS2 to the annual inter school cross country competition; this event is run by our school games organiser. There were 12 local primary schools taking part, which meant each race had over 100 participants. This is an event in which we always do very well, and this year was no exception. Some of the pupils have been regulars at representing the school in cross country events; however, this year it was nice to see some different pupils taking part – also our Year 3s who competed for the first time.

One of the pupils who has represented the school at cross country before commented that they had improved their placing by running regularly for the last year at the club.
