On Wednesday this week, two teams of Year 6 boys travelled to Spalding Academy to take part in the school games football competition, run by Agilitas Sports. Despite the torrential rain, both teams had an excellent day, with lots of teamwork and good sporting attitude demonstrated throughout the event. Both teams played four matches in the morning against other local primary schools from Bourne, Deeping, Spalding and the surrounding area.

The competition was tough with Westfield '1' winning three matches and drawing one. Westfield 'A' narrowly missed out on a draw against Baston but showed great strength of character to continue playing with passion and self-belief even when against the toughest of opposition.

Why is Learning the Times Tables Important?

There are several reasons learning the times tables in primary school is important, including the following:

- Understanding numbers and number patterns;
- Making mental maths easier;
- Frees up working memory.

The Maths team will be delivering a 'Learning the Times Tables' evening on <u>Thursday 23rd November</u> 6:00pm-6:45pm for parents of children in <u>Years 2-6</u> (no children please). The evening will consist of showing how multiplication is taught at Bourne Westfield and useful ideas to support you and your child/ren in practicing times tables at home. We hope you are able to join us.

Spelling Homework

As part the school's recent adoption of Active Spelling, pupils will no longer be sent home with spelling lists to learn as part of homework. Research currently suggests that the most effective way to support spelling is through explicit instruction and while independent spelling homework can be beneficial, it can negatively affect some pupils.

At Bourne Westfield, we are happy for pupils to continue practising tricky words and year group spellings should they wish to, but we will no longer be expecting pupils to practise words from given spelling lists.

Poppies

Next week, we will once again be selling poppies at school in the lead up to Remembrance Day. We would encourage children to bring a small donation (20p minimum) to give to this worthwhile cause. Poppies will be available in all classrooms in the lead up to Remembrance Day.
