- Vocabulary and reading reciprocal relationship ← □
- Everyday conversation about a range of subjects
- Model correct vocabulary
- Songs and rhymes
- Repetition activities and games
- Word games oral and board games e.g. I spy, word ladder – change initial letter
- Sharing a wide range of books
- Audio books

Reading

- Daily reading- 1: 1, give time
- Read to your child and be a good role model
- Book Talk! Discuss various aspects of books before reading
 cover, blurb etc; encourage prediction
- Re-read favourite books supports confidence and can help to build fluency
- Find books/reading material related to interests see Love Reading 4 Kids, BBC 500 words
- When learning new words, focus on an average of five words at a time and secure those before moving on-
 - What does word look like? Shape and tricky parts
 - O Does it sound out?
 - Are there any words 'hidden' within it e.g.what
 - Think of other rhyming words with similar spelling e.g.could would should



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Phonological Awareness

- Rhymes, rhyming activities and rhyming books
- Clapping/tapping out syllables
- Beginning, middle and end activities/pictures
- I spy very good with busy pictures
- Treasure Hunt initial sounds
- Robot talk both ways:
 - o parent says word in 'robot speak', e.g. "c-a-t" and the child has to put the sounds together to make a word
 - o parent says a word, e.g. "bed" and the child has to say it in robot speak, e.g.: "b-e-d"
- With older children try spoonerisms swapping around the first sounds of pairs
 of words, e.g. 'chop stick' becomes 'stop chick'

Listening to Reading

- Be patient
- Pre-teach unfamiliar words, where appropriate
- Make and use flash cards for tricky words have them stuck up around the home if appropriate
- Use the Paired Reading strategy wherever this would be supportive (see attached sheet)
- Develop comprehension by:
 - asking the child to summarise every so often, e.g. paragraph, page, section
 - o make comments to prompt responses, rather than asking questions

Spelling

- Use a variety of multisensory strategies (see Practising Spellings at Home pamphlet)
- Mnemonics a friend until the end; busy bus
- Consolidate new words in sentences
