We would like to take this opportunity to tell you a little about what is coming up. As a school, we are currently focusing on improving progress in mathematics and writing as part of our whole 'School Improvement Plan'.

PSHE	<u>Relationships</u> The children will consider their own significant relationships (family, friends and school community) and why these are special and important. As part of the learning on healthy and safe relationships, children learn that touch can be used in kind and unkind ways. This supports later work on safeguarding. The children will be researching a range of marine animals, describing and comparing them.

Geography		<u>Identifying bodies of water</u> We will be learning about the differences and similarities between ponds, rivers, streams, oceans and reservoirs. We will also be building on our knowledge of the United Kingdom by looking at the seas and oceans that surround it.
