PSHE	Being Me	Celebrating Difference
	The children will discuss their hopes and fears for the year ahead - they will talk about feeling worried and recognising when they should ask for help and who to ask.  They will talk about rights and responsibilities, how to work collaboratively, how to listen to each other and how to make their classroom a safe and fair place. The children talk about choices and the consequences of making different choices.	The children will talk about gender stereotypes and that boys and girls can have differences and similarities and that is ok. They talk about children being bullied because they are different, that this shouldn't happen and how to support a classmate who is being bullied. The children talk about feelings associated with bullying and how and where to get help. They talk about similarities and differences and that it is ok for friends to have differences without it affecting their friendship.

Maths	Place Value - partitioning 2-digit numbers in tens and ones, comparing and ordering numbers to 100. Column addition and subtraction with and without regrouping.  To be able to estimate numbers and place them on a blank number line.  We will be practising the x10 multiplication table - please help with this at home.	Money - recognising notes and coins.  Exchanging coins and notes for others of equal value. Adding and subtracting using coins, including giving change. Solving 1-step and 2-step word problems.  Multiplication and Division - make equal groups, add equal groups and making arrays.
Science	Habitats – explaining what habitats and microhabitats are. Go on a walk of the school grounds to observe different habitats. Matching animals to their habitats and considering why animals adapt to live in certain places. Forest School	Food Chains and Living, Dead, Never Alive – Describing how animals obtain their food from plants and animals, using the idea of food chains; identify and name sources of food. To recognise whether things are living, dead or have never been alive.

Computing	Year 2 will be continuing their coding journey from Year 1. Learning how to write programmes, debug programmes and creating their own programmes linked to our Habitats topic.		
D&T	We will create a free- standing structure. The children will design, make and evaluate a bridge to help Max cross the road.	We will create a Christmas decoration during our seasonal celebrations.	
Art	We will create the image of a hedgehog creating a variety of textures using different sketching skills. We will mix colours to create different shades of brown to complete a printed piece.	Brush skills, holding and using a paintbrush correctly, using different brush strokes; dab, smooth, wash, sponge, stipple and stroke.	
Geography	The United Kingdom and Map Skills, countries of the UK and their capital cities  Naming the 5 oceans and the 7 continents.  Within the context of The Hodgeheg, we will learn how to sketch maps, use directional language, create and use a key. We will also consolidate our understanding of where the United Kingdom is within our world. A small study of a non-European country - Kenya.		
History		Remembrance How have the Wars changed Britain? The significance of the poppy flower. Flanders Field.
